MAKING A COMEBACK - Anne Tamblyn as Secretary

Anne's connection to Cornish Hill goes back to the days when the Reserve was to be sold.

Says Anne: "The State Government had made a decision to sell off unwanted Crown Land throughout the state. The Advocate was full of news that the gold mining area of Cornish Hill was to be sold for housing. There was much public comment and the idea was dropped. Council called a meeting to form a Committee of Management to oversee the implementation of the Management Plan, which had already been prepared. I attended the meeting and volunteered. It was decided that I should be Secretary, a position I held for three years, also taking over as Treasurer when the original one resigned. Shortly after I joined the Friends of Cornish Hill as well, and became their secretary. I remember many hours of cutting gorse and blackberries, painting the stumps and burning the tops when dry, followed by the planting of tubes of natives, working with both groups. After three years, work commitments caused me to resign." We are delighted to welcome an old friend back. In the role of Secretary, Anne's knowledge and past experience will be of great help, and we are grateful to her for returning.

TREASURER

Steve Millard has decided to step down from the position of Treasurer. We are keen to fill the vacancy he leaves behind. This will involve setting up spreadsheets for our grants, signing no more than 30 cheques per annum and providing an annual statement for the AGM. We are calling for volunteers for the **MEET THE FOCHERS** event on Saturday 13th October, 10am-Noon.

FOCH aim to foster awareness of living close to and amongst wildlife. Come to the Stanhope Street entrance for this event.

It's National Bird Week from 22-28 October and time again for the <u>Aussie Backyard Bird Count</u>. Birdlife Australia will be in attendance to discuss and promote the Bird Count. We'll talk about the devastating effect that pets such as cats and dogs can have on wildlife, and how owners can help to mitigate this, also reminding dog walkers of the legal responsibilities to prevent dogs from chasing of kangaroos and other wild life.

European Wasps are also a threat to our native pollinators, and we will be demonstrating how to make traps for them.

Volunteers are needed to fold and envelope invitations, and to letterbox invitations to our Cornish Hill neighbours, prior to the event.

On the day, we will need people to help set up before the event, and bring a plate of food to share for morning tea.
