

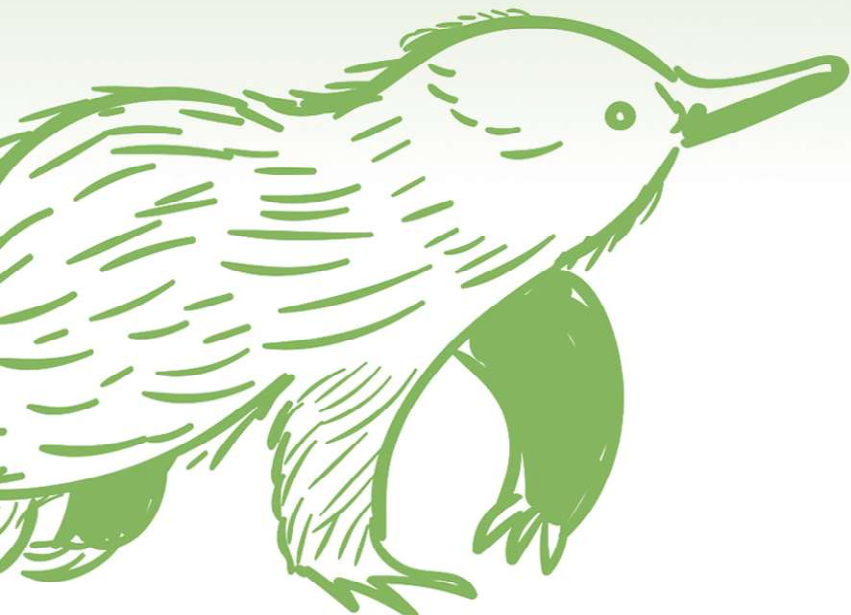
YOUR INVITATION TO MEET THE FOCHERS COMMUNITY EVENT

To find us on the day, look for the signs to enter Cornish Hill Reserve from Stanhope Street where it loops around to join Stanley Street.


